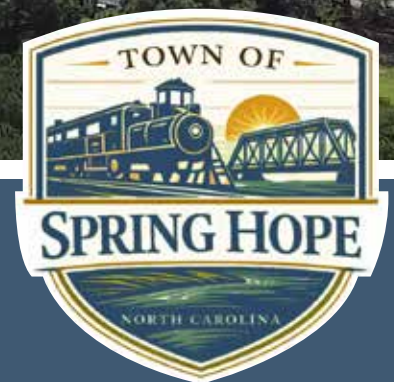


Welcome to The Town of Spring Hope

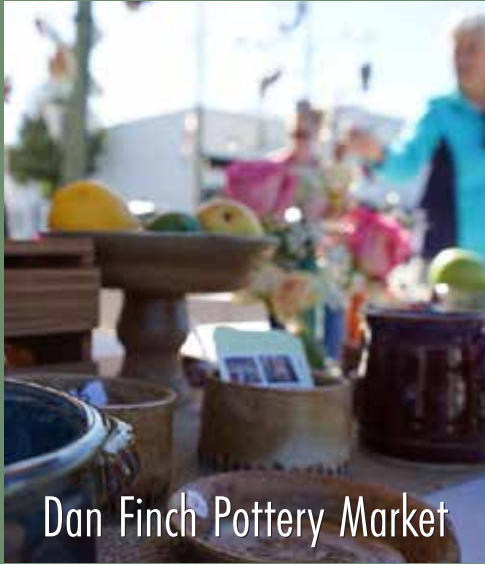
A Town Built on *History*, Shaped by *Heart*, and driven by *Vision*.

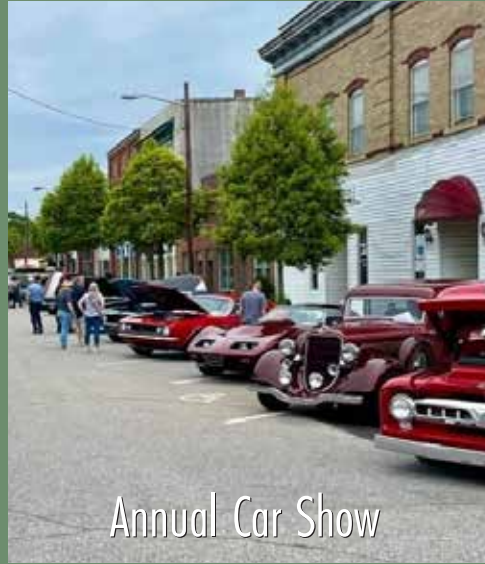

The Spring Hope Historical Museum, located in a restored shotgun house, invites visitors to step back in time and explore the town's journey from pine forests to prosperity.

Spring Hope Historical Museum



Opened in 1989 for the town of Spring Hope centennial celebration. The Spring Hope Historical Association was the founder of the Spring Hope Historical Museum.

The Spring Museum is an admirable example of the importance of preservation of our history and is highly recommended to anyone who wants to see and learn about the architecture in Spring Hope and why it is known as the Town of Many Gables. Antique furniture is on display as well as memorabilia from the late 1800's through the 1920's.
